INTRODUCTION OF ORDINANCE FOR SECOND READING

ORDINANCE NO. 1902

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SALEM AMENDING CITY CODE 225-37, SCHEDULE XI, HANDICAPPED PARKING ZONES

WHEREAS, the handicap parking space at 210 Church Street in the City of Salem created and authorized by Ordinance 03-03 is no longer needed because the resident at the location who needed the handicap space is no longer residing at that address.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Salem, Salem County, New Jersey as follows:

- **Section 1.** Section 225-37, Schedule XI is hereby amended by deleting 201 Church Street as a location for a handicap parking space.
- **Section 2.** Signs restricting the space for handicap parking shall be removed from the location set forth above.
- **Section 3.** If a court of competent jurisdiction shall declare any section, paragraph, subsection, clause or provision of this Ordinance invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole or any part thereof.
- **Section 4.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances of the City of Salem heretofore adopted that are inconsistent with any of the terms and provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of any inconsistency.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 1904

CALENDAR YEAR 2019 MODEL ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.50% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.50% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.50% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Salem in the County of Salem finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2019 budget by up to 3.50% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Salem hereby determines that a 1.00% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$65,285.06 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS the Council of the City of Salem hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Salem, in the County of Salem, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2019 budget year, the final appropriations of the City of Salem shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.50%, amounting to \$228,497.71, and that the CY 2019 municipal budget for the City of Salem be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.
