There was an open discussion for the Governing body regarding cannabis facility. The Mayor had already stated his position prior and resolves to not making any haste decisions. CITY OF SALEM RESOLUTION 2019-80

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MUNICIPAL TAX COLLECTOR TO SEND ESTIMATED TAX BILLS

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 54:4-66.2 authorizes the Collector to prepare and deliver estimated tax bills upon approval of the governing body; and

WHEREAS, David Crescenzi as both the City's Tax Collector and Chief Financial Officer has requested that the City Council authorize estimated bills as he will be unable to complete mailing or delivery of tax bills by the statutory date due to a delay in the passage of the State of New Jersey's budget and the Salem County Tax Board is therefore unable to certify Salem City's tax rate at this time and for other good cause;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Salem, County of Salem and State of New Jersey, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 54:4-66.3, as follows:

- (i) That the Tax Collector is hereby authorized to prepare and mail or otherwise deliver estimated tax bills pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 54:4-66.2.
- (ii) The entire estimated tax levy for 2019, in accordance with the estimate of the Tax Collector/CFO in consultation with the County Tax Board in accordance with N.J.S.A. 54:4-66.3, is hereby set at \$8,968,713.91
- (iii) In accordance with the law the 3rd installment of 2019 taxes shall not be subject to interest until the later of August 10, 2017 or the 25th calendar day after the date the estimated tax bills were mailed. The estimated tax bills shall contain a notice specifying the date on which interest may begin to accrue.

CITY OF SALEM RESOLUTION 2019-81

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF PATH TO PROGRESS RECOMMENDATIONS MADE BY NEW JERSEY ECONOMIC AND FISCAL POLICY WORKGROUP

WHEREAS, New Jersey faces a daunting fiscal crisis; and

WHEREAS, for two decades, while county and municipal governments made the proper pension payments, New Jersey governors from both parties severely underfunded the pension system for teachers and State government workers; and

WHEREAS, while local government pension systems are funded at the national average, the State's unfunded liability for pensions and retiree health benefits now tops \$150 billion – four times the size of the State budget; and

WHEREAS, actuaries project the State will have to increase its pension contribution from \$3.2 billion in this year's budget to \$6.7 billion to reach the Actuarially Required Contribution (ARC) by FY 2023; and

WHEREAS, health care costs continue to rise, and New Jersey and its local governments cannot sustain the unparalleled platinum-level benefits that they provide to their employees; and

WHEREAS, the State has held municipal aid flat, moved the Energy Tax Receipts out of the Property Tax Relief Fund, and with the sunsetting of Chapter 78 relief and the 2% arbitration cap; and

WHEREAS, the State must bring pension and health care costs under control in order to hold down property taxes.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that (name of county or municipality) expresses its support for the recommendations of the Path to Progress report issued by the New Jersey Economic and Fiscal Policy Workgroup; and

RESOLUTION 2019-86 Resolution Authorizing Executive Session

WHEREAS, the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12b permits a public body to go into a closed session during a public meeting to discuss certain matters as follows:

- (1) Matters Required by law to be confidential: Any matter which by express provision of the Federal law or State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act.
- (2) Any matter in which the release of information would impair the right to receive federal funding.
- (3) *Matters involving individual privacy:* Any matter, the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as records, data, reports, recommendations or other personal material of any education, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including, but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned.
- (4) Matters pertaining to a collective bargaining agreement: Any matter involving a collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.
- (5) Matters relating to the purchase, lease acquisition of real property or investment of public funds: Any matter involving the lease, purchase or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds, where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.
- (6) *Matters of public protection:* Any tactic and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection.
- (7) Matters relating to litigation, negotiations and attorney-client privilege: Any matter of pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation other than in (4) above in which the Board is or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required for the attorney to exercise ethical duties as a lawyer.
- (8) Matters relating to the employment relationship: Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of , promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all of the individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed in public.
- (9) Deliberations after public hearing. Deliberations by the Board occurring after a public hearing that may result in a civil penalty or the suspension or loss of a license or permit of a responding party; and

to discuss certain matters relating to the items as permitted by N.J.S.A. 10:4-12b NOW, THERFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Salem that the Council will go into closed session to discuss the following, in accordance with the aforesaid provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act, after which it will reconvene in the public: A. Union Contracts B. Attorney Client Privilege/Pending Litigation Discussion BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the minutes of the closed session will be made
